- Existing 3.65 GHz license issues and terms, including addressing CBRS Interference Coordination issue for grandfather locations
- White Space
- Terragraph
- Funding opportunities, availability, interpretation and policy for USAC, CAF I & II, RDOF, and more
- Challenging the FCC Broadband Maps for accuracy
- 5 GHz power exemptions for extremely rural areas
- Protection and advocacy for potential future spectrum for Rural America
- Networking of quality engineering, service, and equipment manufactures to help insure telco grade support for fixed wireless companies.
- Six (6) GHz Unlicensed expansion
- Wi-Fi 6 standard support
- Updates on FCC's EBS rules for Auction rules
- Advocating frequency expansion in the 3.3-3.55 GHz
- Advocating C-Band 3.7 to 4.2 GHz for rural usage
- Protect and advocate for rural carriers having to replace government banned equipment
- Advancing the Rural 5G discussion and promoting equipment availability
